



The City of Kenmore is prioritizing households that have been negatively affected by COVID-19 and are experiencing financial hardship by distributing \$1 million in direct cash assistance as part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Kenmore has partnered with Northshore Schools Foundation to distribute these funds to low income Kenmore residents who have been adversely impacted by the pandemic. The application process is simple.
